

# SCRUM CONSULTANT (CM-SCC)

## Syllabus

---

Our goal at CertMind is to certify the skills of professionals who perform in the context of Technology. To achieve this, we seek to ensure that professionals demonstrate their skills and knowledge by applying an International Certification Exam.

The purpose of scrum Consultant Certification is to confirm that the professional has the skills as an organizational agility consultant to drive agile initiatives, clearly understanding the conditions and considerations that increase the likelihood of success.

### Who should take this test?

This exam is ideal for people interested in leading organizational change towards agility, and for those who lead portfolios and project programs that have an agile approach.

Roles such as: Scrum Masters, portfolio and program managers, business managers, consultants and IT architects.

### Recommended training time

12 hours, segmented into 3 sessions of approximately 4 hours.

### Certification Exam Format

Type: Exam with 40 questions, multiple selection and with only answer.

Running time: 60 minutes.

Minimum note to approve: 28/40 or 70%

Additional time: If the professional does not take the exam in their native language, they will have an additional 15 minutes to complete the exam and is also allowed to use a dictionary.

Pre-requis: It is highly recommended that the professional attend a formal training of Scrum Consultant and also have experience in portfolios / programs with agile approach.

Supervision: Yes.

Modality: The exam is available online.

Certification Renewal: 30 PUC's (Professional Update Credits) is required every 3 years for certification renewal.
